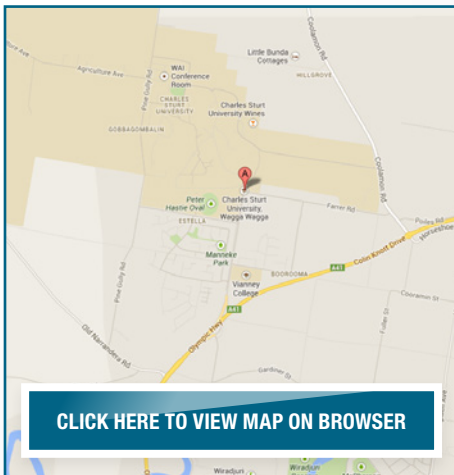

## DR. CHARLES KUNTZ

*DVM, MS, MACVSc,  
DACVS, Fellow of Surgical  
Oncology.*

Charles graduated from the University of Florida in 1990. He did an internship at the AMC in New York City and completed a residency and Master's degree in surgery at Virginia Tech in 1994, achieving specialty board certification in surgery in 1996. Charles did a one year fellowship in cardiovascular research and surgery and then a fellowship in surgical oncology at Colorado State University. Dr Kunz was then professor of Orthopedic Surgery moving to Northern Virginia where he started a surgical referral practice. In 2004 he moved to Australia and is the director of Southpaws Specialty Surgery for Animals in Melbourne. He is an internship director, surgical residency advisor and program director for the American College of Veterinary Surgeons and was voted the 2011 Most Supportive Vet of the Year for all of Australia by the Master Dog Breeders and Associates (MDBA). As a public figure and having extensively taught, spoken, mediated in the field of surgery published widely in many formats including editing the oncology section of Slatter's Textbook of Small Animal Surgery, Dr Kunz has the honour of being accepted as a Founding Fellow in Surgical Oncology by the American College of Veterinary Surgeons for his "Exemplary Training, experience and practice in the multidisciplinary approach to the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation of cancer patients and his devotion to cancer research." He is one of the first people world-wide to have received this honour.

## PROFESSOR GLENN EDWARDS

*BVSc MACVSc*

Glenn is Professor of Veterinary Surgery at Charles Sturt University following a period of 22 years as the academic head of surgery at the University of Melbourne's School of Veterinary Science. He teaches in all aspects of soft tissue surgery, but has a particular interest in minimally invasive surgery, wound healing and management, cardiovascular and urinary tract problems. He has published over 100 papers and chapters in textbooks in the veterinary, biomaterial and medical literature as a result of this work. He was the recipient of the 2006 TG Hungerford Award for Excellence in Post Graduate Education and has recently been awarded the ASAVA Distinguished Scientific Contribution Award.

## DR PETER YOUNG

*BVSc (Hons) MANZCVSc-  
Small Animal Surgery*

Peter graduated in 1980 from Sydney University and spent the next seven years in mixed practice and small animal practice until 2009. During that time he completed his MANZCVSc (1991) and developed an active referral surgical case load and was PENN Hip accredited in 2001. His main professional interests are related to reconstructive skin surgery, analgesia and anaesthesia. In 2010 he was offered a position at Charles Sturt University as a lecturer in small animal surgery and as referral surgeon. This also involves clinical supervision of final year students, a position on the School Board and as Superintendent of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital at CSU. He is also involved with a group at CSU, headed by Prof Glenn Edwards, researching bone healing, dural and vascular grafting, wound healing and vascular stents. Away from work, Peter continues his interest in martial arts, bush walking and travel, along with a healthy interest in good food and wine.
