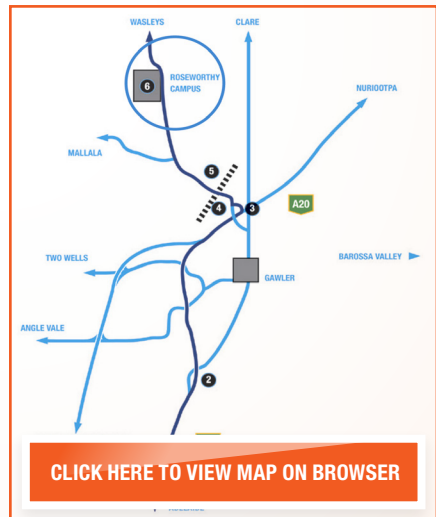

Steve's particular interests are in cancer surgery (surgical oncology), surgical diseases of the spine, and canine arthroscopic surgery.
