

## **Navigating Difficult Clinical Encounters Workshop, Royal Motor Yacht Club of NSW, Point Piper, information.**


### **Workshop location and Transport**

The Navigating Difficult Clinical Encounters workshop is being held at the Royal Motor Yacht Club of NSW, Point Piper, a suburb 13 minutes drive from the Sydney CBD and some 20 minutes drive from the Sydney Domestic Terminal. Please see the map for details.

The cost of an Uber from Sydney Domestic Terminal to the workshop location is about \$40; the cost of a taxi is about \$50. Both fares will be affected by the time of travel and tolls. The Uber stand is located at the T2 Domestic Terminal at the Priority Pickup zone (please see enclosed map). The taxi rank is also located at the Domestic Terminal.



If you're not hiring an Uber, taxi, or a private vehicle, public transport is the way to go! The Domestic Terminal railway station is located directly below the Sydney Domestic Terminal – the airport signage will show you how to get there. You can catch a T8 Airport South Line train service (green line) into the city, either Central or Town Hall, and if you're staying in the Eastern Suburbs, then catch a T4 Eastern Suburbs and Illawarra Line (dark blue line) service to Kingscross, Edgecliff or Bondi Junction.



Trains run on the T8 Airport South Line every 10-15 minutes; trains run on the T4 Eastern Suburbs and Illawarra Line every 10 minutes. For more precise train timetabling information please check the [Trip Planner](#).

The 324/325 bus services will take you from Town Hall to New South Head Rd near Wunulla Rd, a mere 10 minute walk from the workshop location. These bus services will also pickup from Kingscross Station and Edgecliff Station (please see the map for bus stop details). For more precise bus and/ or train timetabling, information please check the [Trip planner](#) or download the [TripView app](#). The 324 and 325 are more frequent from Edgecliff Station.

If you want to see the harbour, there's no better way than travelling by ferry to Rose Bay. Board at Circular Quay and take a lovely 13 minute ferry ride to Rose Bay. From Rose Bay wharf it is but a 20 minute walk to the workshop location. For more Rose Bay ferry information check the [Rose Bay Ferry Trip Planner](#).

To catch a train or bus, you will need an Opal card or Opal single ticket. Using an Opal card is the easiest and most affordable way to travel in Sydney. You can get Adult Opal cards and single trip tickets at the airport train stations, Woolworths,

7-11 and some news agencies, and top up the balance of an existing Opal card. You can also purchase Adult Opal single tickets from the bus driver.
